Worksheet for ages 11 to 14 years old

1. What day is it today in the Church's calendar?

That means that next Sunday is what special day?

Lent will be over in just two weeks! You have just 14 days left to make Lenten sacrifices for Jesus. Is there anything you'd like to change in your Lenten resolutions?

2. From which book of the Bible is the first reading?

3. From which Psalm is the Responsorial?

4. From which book of the Bible is the second reading?

5. From which book of the Bible is the Gospel?

6. Listen carefully to the homily and write down two major points that were made.

7. Did you receive Holy Communion, today? Did you receive in your hands or on your tongue?

In some Catholic churches, today, the priest asks everyone to receive the Body of Christ directly on their tongue, and not in their hands. This is to show reverence for Jesus' sacred Body. If you have not received on your tongue lately, it's a good idea to practice. The next time you receive Holy Communion, keep your hands folded and receive the Eucharist on your tongue.

8. *Agnus Dei* means "Lamb of God". It is one of the prayers that we often say in Latin during Mass. It's a good prayer to know by heart. See if you can memorize the first line this week:

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi: Miserere nobis.

{ag-noos day-ee, kwee toll-ees pay-ca-ta moon-dee: meez-uh-ray-ray no-bees}

Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.
